ADJECTIVES AND ADVERBS

An adjective ...

- ✓ is a "describing" word.
- ✓ describes a noun.
- ✓ gives more information about the noun.
- ✓ is placed before the noun :

The orange mouse is walking in the woods.

A terrible monster comes out at night.

- ✓ is placed after the verb in a descriptive sentence:

The mouse appears orange.

An adverb ...

- ✓ describes a verb or an adjective.
- ✓ it is usually formed by adding -ly at the end of an adjective :

terrible - a terribly scary monster

horrible dark woods - horribly dark

woods The mouse walked slowly.

- ✓ Yesterday, now, sometimes, very, here, there, are also adverbs.


